This week I completed various projects to organize and further my investigation into pharmacy and allowing me to explore my interest. Also, I conducted an interview with the pharmacist manager at Baylor Scott and White Medical Center in Frisco. Her experience is hospital pharmacy has given me a new viewpoint in my studies so far this year. Furthermore, this week helped me evaluate and better organize myself for future projects and assessments. I was introduced to start thinking about what my final project will be and keep it in the back of my mind for the next couple of weeks, as it will be something that represents my passion for the field I'm studying and how my research affects how I perceive my future career.
